

"I am deeply grieved, even to death; remain here, and keep awake." ~Mark 14: 34, NRSV

The Jewish Passover is about to begin. The day after is what we Christians usually call Palm Sunday. It is a time of celebrating the Triumphal Entry of "King" Jesus into the Holy City of Jerusalem. However, it also can be referred to as Passion Sunday as a way of looking forward to the coming week of shame. *Passion* comes from Latin which means to suffer, to endure.

Palm Sunday is loud and joyful. Passion Sunday is quiet and mournful. It all depends upon your perspective – present celebration or future sadness. On Jesus' final night—in Mark 14—He cautions Peter, James, and John to "keep awake." The context is that they are to effectively stand guard, not just physically but also spiritually. In the Greco -Roman-Jewish first century world, the presence of evil/temptation is especially pronounced at night. Things haven't changed much, have they?

The message on Passion Sunday is all about the spiritual discipline of Silence. This is a scary subject in our pandemic-ridden world of 2021. But the challenge is made to practice more silence in our lives. Why? Didn't your mother ever tell you that God gave you two ears and one mouth so you should listen twice as much as you speak? It's a funny way of saying that if you are speaking, if we let noise crowd your life, then there is space left to listen to God.

It is my hope and prayer that you—and I—will listen to God this Holy Week, now more than ever. We have the "trifecta" of Spy Wednesday, Holy Thursday, and Good Friday. Each of these three evenings I will offer a brief "live" online worship experience at 7:00 pm. A little music, a Bible message/devotional, and maybe even some silence. You are invited to participate in this week of reflection.

Good Friday is always the hardest for me. Some years are better than others, but it is still a difficult time. Though, as Philadelphia professor/theologian Tony Campolo is famous for saying, "Friday's here, but Sunday's a-comin'."

Let's get through Holy Week first. Thank you for your faithfulness in-person and online. While I get my strength from the Holy Spirit, your prayers and words of encouragement are precious to me.

Both events will be celebrated in-person in the Tabernacle Sanctuary at 9:15am with online-only worship from PG's office (or Parsonage Porch) at 11am.
