"Everyone who hears these words of mine and acts on them will be like a wise man who built his house on rock. . .

And everyone who hears these words of mine and does not act on them will be like a foolish man who built his house on sand."

(Jesus speaking in Matthew 7: 24 – 27, NRSV)

Visiting the Jersey Shore and living at the Jersey Shore are two different things. As a kid, my family would rent a house near the beach for a week in August. But once I move here to serve as Tabernacle's pastor, it's another matter entirely.

One of the places that amazes me is the "metropolis" of West Wildwood. Why are the houses built on stilts? What would happen if they just sit flat on the ground? You know the answer. The combination of the back bays and the ocean mixed with storms and high tides would wipe them out.

It's easy to take this passage and turn it into a conversation about proper construction techniques. But Jesus is using this illustration to offer a bigger picture. "Everyone who hears these words of mine . . ." must respond in one of two ways: do something or do nothing.

These verses mark the end of what we call the Sermon On The Mount. Jesus is calling His audience back to what He says in chapter five, six, and seven. These are more than words to read. They mark a radical new way to *live*. Go back and re-read these chapters. Following Jesus' words will let your "house" stand firm even in the midst of the storms of pandemics, economics, and the other "winds and waves" that life blows upon us. Whether we stand firm or get washed out to sea depends upon our foundation in Jesus.

Our current series at Tabernacle is called <u>Gre>ter Than</u>. On Sunday, November 8, we will explore the difference between a "quick fix and an "investment." Later this month, an Estimate of Giving card will be distributed and you will be asked to—by faith—consider how much the Lord wants you to (financially) give in 2021. I know it's been a rough year with another likely to follow. But as a community that exists *by faith*, Tabernacle must move beyond a quick fix and look ahead to making an investment in the future for our community and our world.

May our lives be built on the solid rock of Jesus Christ. Let us act on His words. The winds will indeed blow and the waves will certainly pound. Will we be standing firm through the storm? Join with me and shout a resounding, "YES!" Daily Blessings, Pastor Glenn
