[The Gentile woman] answers [Jesus], "Sir, even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs." (Mark 7: 28, NRSV)

Read verses 24 – 30. The moral of this story? The Gospel message of Jesus Christ is for <u>everybody</u>, without exception. Jesus leaves his hometown region to travel northwest to a very pagan land that worships quite differently than His own Jewish people.

On His journey, Jesus meets a Gentile. Anyone who is not Jewish is called a Gentile. And the person Jesus meets is a woman who begs Him to save her young daughter. This female-to-male, Gentile-to-Jew interaction very likely would not happen. It would be a cultural "faux pas."

Jesus essentially tells the woman that His message is for the Jews, the "children" in this story. You have read the woman's response. This passage—this very verse—is an easy choice in the current Deep Impact series of some of my favorite Bible stories. I weep pretty much every time I read it.

The pandemic may have pushed you into a solitary, lonely place – physically and spiritually speaking. This Gentile woman's child is suffering and her "gods" could not help. She takes a risk—perhaps a fatal choice—to invite the Miracle Healer into her world, her circle, her heart.

The "thought for the day" is really a question for <u>every</u> day: Do I have the faith of this woman to trust Jesus with my life?

Catch the whole story Sunday, May 30, at 9:15 am. Maybe it will help with your answer.
