The second candle of the Advent wreath is Peace. In Jesus' day, the nation of Israel is far from a peaceful place. The Roman Empire is a hard oppressor fo the Jewish people. In Isaiah's day, the same can be said of the Assyrian Empire — brutal dictators, to say the least. Here in 2020, our enemy is molecular and unseen to the naked eye except for the death and destruction we *can* see through its impact.

Of course, I cannot make medical pronouncements. You know this and I know this. But what about those "rough patches" in life that we <u>can</u> control? God calls us to be a *righteous* people — individually and corporately. Are you? Are we? He also says one solution to our dilemma is to wait. That's a tough one, I know. But the Lord has brought us through challenging times before and He asks us to honor and cherish this trust that His decisions are righteous and just.

Verse nine uses that graphic phrase, "My soul yearns for you in the night". It is not wrong to say that we are currently living "in the night". But some translations include this yearning, this seeking, this desiring of the Lord early in the morning too.

"Why, me/us, O Lord?" So that we may *learn righteousness*. Like I wrote last week, this sounds a bit harsh, but it is real. The candle of Hope gives way to the light of Peace. Life is temporary. We all know this. God's righteousness and justice live forever. And so shall we. If only we believe — in the night *and* in the morning.
